Six year old Elizabeth and 10 year old Analise are busy making floral arrangements for shut ins,

Meanwhile, Kathy is harvesting bundles of chard (60 bundles are needed every week)..

The bundles are kept in buckets of water, one color for each Farm Stand. Kathy is aided by Tami who took all of the pictures.



Here Norma, Marj and Ruth are bagging the kale, Malabar spinach, collards and chard that were picked on Monday. They also separate hot peppers into four bags for each of the farm stands.



Analise, Elizabeth, their mother and younger brother, Ezra, have also bagged cherry tomatoes and picked and bagged green beans.

Analise and Elizabeth have helped divide all of the cucumbers, eggplant, peppers and squash into four groups in styrofoam containers. The bagged produce is divided and put into the containers, too. There is a whole table of tomatoes in trays. Each Farm Stand will receive their share.

After the food is divided, it is taken to the different Farm Stands so it will be ready to hand out on Wednesday.



This is the total week's harvest. The picture will be forwarded to Grass Roots New England and Bank of Newport, who awarded us grants to start the Florence Gray Farm Stand in Newport.
